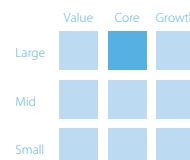

The Fund seeks to provide investors with capital appreciation by investing in companies that are leading the transition to a climate-resilient economy.

Investment Style

- The Fund invests at least 80% of its net assets in equity or equity related securities of companies that are believed to be developing solutions for net-zero emissions or companies that may benefit from positive changes in climate transition processes
- Seeks three categories of companies (collectively referred to as the "climate transition investment universe") that may benefit from climate transition impacts; solution providers, transition leaders and adaptation opportunities
- Employs a high-conviction approach to individual investment selection and will typically hold 40-60 stocks under normal conditions
- Includes contribution to development of substitutes/remediation measures for carbon intensive business models
- Expands beyond solution providers inclusive of transition and adaptation companies accessing a wider opportunity set for potential outperformance

Active Share measures the percentage of the Fund's holdings that differ from those of the benchmark. It is calculated by taking the sum of the absolute difference between all of the holdings and weights in the portfolio and those of the benchmark holdings and weights and dividing the result by two.

The Weighted Harmonic Average measures the valuation of the portfolio as a whole. For price/earnings ratio, it is the ratio of the portfolio's total market value in equities to its share of the underlying stocks' earnings. For price/book ratio, it is the ratio of the portfolio's total market value in equities to its share of the underlying book value. This method evaluates the entire portfolio like a single stock and it minimizes the impact of outliers.

A Word About Risk
